Priority No.1

A lot of our time is being taken up with objecting to unsustainable planning applications submitted to Charnwood Borough Council for Anstey. There are currently over 1,000 new houses proposed for Anstey and we are strongly objecting to them by writing robust reports to Charnwood Planning team on your behalf. Without vast improvements to our infrastructure, we cannot accommodate this huge increase to the village.

We have also contacted National Highways (who look after the A46 & A50). They too are very concerned about the increase in traffic that the proposed developments will have on our local road network.

We Need Your Help

Comments can still be made on the planning applications that haven't been decided, so we would encourage as many residents as possible to send in their comments. This will reinforce our concerns, we need to have a whole village response to all these developments currently planned for our village.

Priority No.2

Our mail boxes are regularly full of concerns about fly-tipping, litter, and dog fouling. When we see fly-tipping, we request that it is removed as soon as possible to try to prevent further fly-tipping. We now have more signage in place, warning of the consequences of fly tipping. We have secured more dog bins around the village to try and encourage dog owners to pick up their dog fouling and place it in the bins instead of hanging bags in trees and bushes. We also request 'clean ups' of areas where there is a large amount of dog fouling. We support the litter wombles in the village as much as we can and go on the litter picks. We want to encourage more residents to support the wombles.

Election Changes For Anstey

There is a new requirement to show photo ID at polling stations and this is being introduced for the first time for the elections in May. Residents in Anstey will be required to show an acceptable form of photo ID when voting at polling stations.

Acceptable ID includes your: driving licence; passport; blue badge; bus pass; or out-of-date ID (if your picture still looks like you!).

If you do not have one of the suitable forms of ID you can apply for a free ID called a 'Voter Authority Certificate' which can only be used for elections.

If you are worried about this, you may find it easier to apply for a postal vote but you will need to do this by **18th April 2023** at the latest. All the information you need is on our website www.bradgateconservatives.org.uk or please contact one of us.

Anstey residents will now have two polling stations. You will only be able to vote at your allocated Polling Station. Your Polling District will be marked on your polling card. 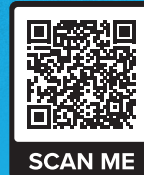
